






Kick-Off Friday, July 2, 2004 41st National Basque Festival




Parade Grand Marshall The Family of Louie Uriarte


was appointed Governor of New Mexico by the King of Spain. He served in Santa Fe for ten years as Governor, where, among other things, he tracked down the rengade Comanche Chief, Cuerno Verde, with 800 soldiers and 2500 head of horses. He killed the chief and other leaders of the group. This eventually culminated in the signing of the longest lasting peace treaty with the Comanche Nation by any group associated with them, including Spain, Mexico and the United States. The peace treaty that Anza put together in 1785 was still fully in effect when United States westward movement started. The Comanches were at peace with the white man and caused very little grief for the thousands of immigrants who came west. The history of the United States, and specifically the West, would have been entirely different had it not been for Juan Bautista de Anza. He returned to Sonora in 1787, again as commander of all the Sonoran Troops. He was appointed commander of the Tucson Presidio in 1788 and did a review of troops there, but died in December before moving to Tucson to take command. He was buried beneath the floor of the cathedral in Arizpe, Sonora, about 150 miles southeast of Tucson.

Juan Bautista de Anza: In the Service of the King

An interactive living history program by United States National Park Service Historian Don Garate in which Juan Bautista de Anza is portrayed in full costume and in first person. Mr. Garate presents Anzas personal history in stories and songs in both Spanish and English and involves the audience directly by speaking with them both individually and collectively and answering any questions that arise during the course of the presentation. The audience is asked to go back in time to 1787, the year Anza completed his ten-year term as governor of New Mexico. The entire program, including questions and other audience interaction, is presented relative to that year, although the presenter will come out of character at the end of the program to answer any questions that could not be answered in 1787. The program truly

makes history come alive.

Juan Bautista de Anza was a Basque born in Cuquiárachi, Sonora, Mexico in 1736. His father, who had the same name, was born in Hernani, Gipuzkua, Euskadi in 1693 and came to New Spain in 1712. He eventually became the Captain of the Presidio of Fronteras, 20 miles south of Douglass, Arizona in Sonora, Mexico. He was killed by Apaches when Juan Bautista, Jr. was only three years old. Growing up in Sonora (and what is today Arizona), young Juan was involved early in Apache attacks and uprisings by other Indian groups. He joined the frontier military at age fifteen and eventually became the Captain of Tubac Presidio, which is



today in southern Arizona. Serving there for seventeen years he was wounded twice by Apaches and twice by Seri Indians. In 1774, with the backing of the powerful Basque financiers and politicians in Mexico City, he led a group of soldiers in an exploratory expedition to find a route from Sonora to California. Having success in that endeavor he led some three hundred settlers, soldiers, and workers to California the following year to establish a colony on the San Francisco Bay. The expedition lasted a year, starting with recruiting people in Culiacán, Sinaloa, Mexico in March 1775, and culminating with their arrival in the Bay Area in March of 1776. Returning from California, Anza was first appointed commander of all the troops in Sonora and then, in reward for the suc-

cessful establishment of the San Francisco Presidio and the Dolores Mission, he







Basque Language

Basque, or Euskara, is a language spoken by about a million people in northern Spain and southwestern France. Although attempts have been made to link it to ancient Iberian, the Hamito-Semitic group, and Caucasian, its origins remain uncertain.

The sound pattern resembles that of Spanish, with its five pure vowels and such peculiarities as a trilled r and palatal n and l. In spite of this, and the presence of numerous Latinate loanwords, Basque has maintained its distinctiveness throughout two millennia of external contacts. For example, it still places a unique emphasis on suffixes to denote case and number and to form new words.

Basque is the only language remaining of those spoken in southwestern Europe before the Roman conquest. Since the 10th century, it has gradually been supplanted by Castilian Spanish, and under the Franco regime its use in Spain was outlawed altogether. The ethnic insularity of the Basques, however, has fostered revivals. Attempts are now being made to standardize the orthography.





THE LAUBURU AND ITS SYMBOLISM


Imanol Mujica, a Basque intellect, who wore the Lauburu in his heart, like many of us, gave a conference about the Lauburu's symbolism on May 25, 1968 in Bogota, Colombia. Here is an excerpt of that

evening, illustrating Mr. Mujica's search for a theory or the truth of the Lauburu.

"The Lauburu (or 4 headed cross), is the oldest Basque coat of arms, that distinctly raised victorious banners for the "vardulo", "caristio" and "austrigon" tribes during the early part of the Basque history (200 years BC.). Previous to that time, the Basque emblem may have had naturalistic, religious and philosophical meanings as expressed by numerous authors. It may have also had a cosmic, astronomy, meteorological or anthropomor-

phous expression for the Basque pagans at that time. What is certain is that when the roman troops reached the Basque area, the Lauburu was a Basque ensign and used at that moment as a war banner to defend the territory that was being threatened by imperial legions.

Could this four headed emblem have something to do with the unity and continuity of the Basque people? Fifteen to twenty centuries later the Lauburu may have regained its authentic meaning given by the Basque people. This can be seen from its usage on door lintels, on the beams in the "case-



rios", on the "kutxas", on family coat of arms, on Basque furniture and particularly on the "argizayolas" of the hermitages and on the tombstones. This symbol has been adopted by the Romans and the nazis in its linear Form, as a sign of brute force and modern barbarity. The Emperor Augusto took the emblem from the Pyrenees to Rome as a symbol of false triumph over the Basque troops. The Emperor Constantino christianized the symbol identifying it with the Cross of Calvary. The nazis misused it to promote there totalitarian party.

Mr. Mujica believes that the Lauburu symbolizes mankind, made up of four elements: Form, Life, Sensibility and Conscience.






